

## We report when we have reason to suspect or know that harm is being done. What is considered harm?

- Evidence of skin bruising, bleeding, malnutrition, failure to thrive, burns, fracture of any bone, subdural hematoma, soft tissue swelling, or death when
  - The evidence is not justifiably explained or is different than would be expected
  - The evidence does not appear to be an accident
- A child is subjected to unlawful sexual behavior.
- A child needs food, clothing, shelter, medical care, or supervision because the parents/guardians are not doing so.
- A child lacks proper parental care through actions or omissions of the parent/guardian.
- A child's intellectual or psychological functioning or development is impaired (or is at risk of being impaired) due to emotional abuse.
- A child has been abandoned or subjected to mistreatment/abuse without the parent/guardian taking actions to stop/prevent the mistreatment or abuse.
- A child's environment is injurious to the child's welfare.
- A child is in the presence where a controlled substance is manufactured.
- A child tests positive at birth for a controlled substance (with some exceptions based on the type of substance).
